



The Midshires Way in Leicestershire

The Midshires Way is a long-distance multi-user route across Middle England, particularly suited for horse riding and mountain biking. It was launched in 1994 as a collaboration between numerous local authorities and user groups.

The route is approximately 225 miles long. It links two National Trails, The Ridgeway and The Pennine Bridleway, and connects with the Trans-Pennine Trail, thus opening up the possibility of a long ride or walk along the length of England.

For the most part, The Midshires Way follows public bridleways or quiet country lanes. In other counties, where there are sections on roads, alternative footpath routes have been waymarked for walkers. However, there are no waymarked alternative footpath sections in Leicestershire. The main Leicestershire section is about 30 miles long.

The Midshires Way is clearly marked on Ordnance Survey Explorer 1:25,000 scale maps. These are the most up-to-date source of information covering the route.

The following Explorer maps show the complete route in Leicestershire 233 (Leicester & Hinckley), 246 (Loughborough), 245 (The National Forest), 260 (Nottingham).





The route is signposted throughout with the Midshires Way symbol (pictured above), either on separate panels or waymark arrows, and named on bridleway signs where the route leaves public roads.

The majority of the Leicestershire stretch of The Midshires Way is outlined below, split into seven sections between Sutton Bassett (Northamptonshire) and the Nottinghamshire border north of Old Dalby.

There is a further 4½ mile section in the North West corner of Leicestershire, between Kegworth and Derwent Mouth – please see OS Explorer map 245.





Section 2 – Cranoe to Tugby – 4.5 miles (7km)

At Cranoe, go straight over the cross roads, just after the church, take BW (B30) on right into a hilly grass field. Go to gate in far left comer, then with hedge on left through arable field.

Continue straight ahead across next grass field, with hedge on right gradually getting closer approaching gate.

(Going south, be careful NOT to head for the gate in the far left corner – it is for a different BW!)

Continue, with hedge on left, through arable field to east-west track (Goadby Road). Go left round pond, then right beyond hedge onto grass track for two fields. This becomes a metalled surface.

Continue straight ahead, and over cross roads into **Tugby** village (PH)

Section 3 - Tugby to Tilton-on-the-Hill - 4 miles (6km)

Go through Tugby village. Cross the busy A47 road with care – limited sightlines – into Wood Lane opposite.

Take first BW (B81) on left; the track has a hedge on left for three fields, then is cross field to join another BW beside the A47 road.

Turn right onto this BW (C92), which aims for Tilton Church. Go through gate into an arable field; hedge on left.

At clump of trees on left, hedge turns away left, but BW continues across field, bearing left to gateway to left of houses.

Take track opposite, to Welsh Myers Farm. Water Trough. The route goes along the hedge for one field, then bears left cross field to a small bridge Go left through the gate in hedge, and bear right uphill (*), cutting off two comers in this arable field. At the top, go through field gate on right.

(southwards, cross hedge to right to get into arable field)

Bear left cross-field to field gate onto road.

Go into vast arable field opposite, keeping roughly parallel to the Eye Brook. Head for the bottom of the trees/hedge coming downhill on left, to cross wide ditch by the cart bridge. BW and brook gradually converge. At far hedge, take bridge over brook into smaller arable field (*).


In far left corner bear left through 'Christmas Trees', down to gateway into corner of arable field.

Go through bridle gate into grass field, with plantation on your left. Water Trough.

Go through remains of hedge and join drive from house on right. At last cattle grid, go right along fence to find gate into Loddington Road.

Turn left towards Tilton-on-the-Hill village (PH).

Follow road signs for Houghton-onthe-Hill, left and right, onto Back Road, At T-junction, turn left onto B6047, then right.

Section 4 - Tilton-on-the-Hill to Ashby Folville - 7.5 miles (12km)

After houses. Turn right into 'Gated Road'. This is a UCR, marked as a double-dotted line on OS. The first field has new barn, on left. Go through field gate, then straight ahead to field gate on skyline.

Continue straight on – now back on original line – parallel to hedge on left, until a hedge comes uphill towards you. Turn left to find track, with hedge left. On a clear day, you can see the cooling towers at Ratcliffe-on-Soar, which the way passes just before it crosses into Derbyshire. Track goes down Hamner's Lodge Farm, through disused railway, and up to road at Skeg Hill.

Cross to BW (D2) to right. Head left cross field to bridle gate in far comer, and go along hedge down to bridge. Cross brook, and go through gate beside hunt jump. Turn left along hedge over hill, to gate on bridge, then up grass field to gate by water trough. Continue cross field, heading for triangular road sign.

Cross road into spinney, following track to small gate, then ahead through horse paddock. Cross the farm drive, through bridle gate into another paddock. Bear right to bridle gate on far side.

Go across filed over 2 fields. At far hedge, turn right onto new BW (D38) without going through the gate.

(southwards, look for waymarks in hedge that mark left turn).

Go hedge side, on left, through 2 bridle gates. Then, in arable (*), cross field to third bridle gate. Drop down to Carr Bridge /ford. Follow sign to Twyford.

(southwards, sign to Hungarton)


Go through field gate next to hunt jump, and sharply uphill, continuing with hedge on left to road.


Tum left on road. Take first farm track to Freezeland Lodge. Continue past farm to arable field, where BW (I94) starts. Line bears slightly left cross field, sighting on centre of far wood between farm to right and Ashby Folville Hall to left. (Line of trees to left, marked on map, has gone).


In front of wood is a line of trees on nearer hill. Just after crossing footpath mid field, waymark post at right end of trees should be visible.

> (southwards, from this post bear left, sighting between a smaller tree and a stump in the line of trees on south side of field).

> > From post, bear more sharply left cross field (or go left, then right, on tracks) to bridge. Turn right onto track, to road. Turn left to **Ashby Folville** village (PH)
