Medieval Campus Walk DMU Heritage Centre

Start location: Castle Motte, 7 Castle View, Leicester, LE1 5WH **Time taken:** 30 minutes **Distance:** 0.7 kilometers / 0.4 Miles

Description: De Montfort University and its campus, sit at the heart of Leicester, in an area that is steeped in history. This self-guided tour by DMU Heritage Centre will give you an insight into one of the oldest parts of the city, from its ancient origins to its manufacturing heyday.

Directions:

- 1. From Castle Motte (1) bear right through Castle Gardens towards Castle Street.
- 2. Turn right onto Castle Street.
- 3. Turn right onto Castle View. On your right you will see the Great Hall(2). On your left you will see St Mary de Castro (3).
- 4. Continue straight ahead on Castle View, passing the Castle Inn (4) on your right.
- 5. Continue straight ahead on Castle View, passing under the Turret Gateway (5).
- 6. Turn right onto The Newarke, passing Trinity Hospital (6) on your right until you reach Chantry House (7) on the corner of The Newarke and The Gateway.
- 7. Turn 180 degrees and re-trace your steps back along The Newarke, passing the Church of Annunciation, DMU Heritage Centre (8) on your right.
- 8. Continue straight ahead on The Newarke, until you reach the Magazine (9), your end destination.
