

### Thorpe Acre Circuit


A small nature reserve and a hedge lined track

At the junction with **Mount Grace Road**, on **Lindisfarne Drive** start from the information noticeboard and follow the stoned path down into the Stonebow Washlands nature reserve. Follow the path along the left hand side of the reserve past the ponds and cross over a boardwalk. After exiting through a squeeze barrier, turn left and follow the hedged path down to a kissing gate. Turn left again and follow the track alongside an old wall to the gate that leads onto Coe Avenue. Follow this to its junction with Althorpe Drive, turn left and then left again into Buckingham Drive. Follow this as far as the Black Brook. Immediately after the road bridge turn left and follow the brook to the next bridge, which is on Mount Grace Road. Turn left and return to your start point.















### Dishley and the Black Brook

A riverside and lakeside walk with plenty of wildlife

Start on Barsby Drive, where it bridges the Black Brook, and follow the riverside path north under the A6 Derby Road bridge then left to the sports pitches. At the access road turn right, and then right again where the access road bridges over the brook. Immediately after this, take the path left to follow the right hand bank of the brook. There are yellow topped waymark posts to show the way; these are used on public Rights of Way throughout Leicestershire. Continue in the same direction with the lake on your right and then continue straight on to where the brook joins the **River Soar**. Turn left, over the bridge at the end of the brook, then left again to walk back down the other side of the brook towards used on public Rights of Way throughout Leicestershire. Continue in the same direction with the lake Dishley. Cross the footbridge at the top corner of the playing fields and retrace your steps to Dishley.











### Hospital Round

Open spaces and a pleasant stroll around Loughborough Hospital








On Cumberland Road, opposite the junction with Rosebery Street, head down Hospital Walk, a tarmac path running alongside the playing fields. After reaching Hospital Way, on your right just before the Epinal Way Care Centre, turn right down an alley called Bowler Way towards Burleigh Brook, and follow the brook to reach Epinal Way. Turn left uphill along the main road, passing the hospital on your left. Then turn left again through a staggered barrier into another alley called Rosebery Way. Follow this to Ashby Road, turn left, then left again into Cumberland Road and back to your start point.


### **Queen's Park Ranger**

### All Saints Loop


A short stroll around the historic heart of the town




From the main iron churchyard gates on **Steeple Row** walk towards **Church Gate**. Turn left and then left again down Fearon Jitty (an alley), just before the Windmill pub, keeping Loughborough's historic parish church of All Saints on your left. Many of the buildings in this area are much older than their frontages suggest, some date back to the 16th Century. At the far corner of the churchyard go down the shallow steps and follow Rectory Road to the bottom. Turn left up Toothill Road and then left again into Rectory Place to get back to your start point.

Whilst on Rectory Place, you can make a short detour to the 13th Century Old Rectory Museum and Community Garden.













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

#### An Old Branch Line

A tree lined stroll down the route of an old railway line









From **Pitsford Drive** take the old railway line on the right towards the town centre. This is part of the old **Charnwood Forest** Railway built in the early 1880s linking Loughborough and Coalville. It was closed to passengers in 1931. The route crosses

Ravensthorpe Drive and on reaching the next road, Hurstwood Road, either retrace your steps or return via the adjacent streets. To do this turn left and follow Ravensthorpe Drive as far as Grassholme Drive on your right. Turn into this, up the hill, and at the top take the tarmac path on the left between numbers 30 and 32 to reach a small park. Cross to the highest point of the park and then go downhill (taking extra care as it may be slippery), to the left of the play area, to rejoin the old railway. Turn right to return to your start point. The route can be extended towards the town centre if you are feeling energetic and wish to explore further.







### The Outwoods and views of Loughborough

A countryside walk to the woods above Loughborough offering fine views of the town

From the Nanpantan Road, just after Watermead Lane, take the tarmac track signposted as 'Footpath to the Outwoods'. Follow the footpath where it turns right, off the track and becomes a path signposted uphill towards the woods. On reaching the trees go through the kissing gate and turn immediately left following the path inside the wood that parallels the boundary fence. Just before reaching the charcoal kilns turn sharp right, almost back on yourself, over a small footbridge and past a shelter. Ignore any paths branching off on either side until the path comes to a 'T' junction at a fence ahead of you. Turn right and follow the path back to the kissing gate where you entered the woods, then retrace your route back to the start.















#### **Mountfields Lodge and Views** of the Outwoods

A walk following the Wood Brook with views of the Outwoods on the way back

Start from the car park at the far end of **Moat Road** and head back along the road. Where the road widens and curves uphill to the right, take the path from the corner which follows Wood Brook. Cross Priory Road and continue until you reach Valley Road. Cross over with care, and take Woodbrook Road opposite. Just after Sandalwood Road, take the cycleway on the left, sign posted to the University Colleges. Continue on this path, along the brook, crossing Outwoods Drive. (If you want a shorter route, turn right here and go on to Outwoods Road). Cross Holt Drive and carry on as far as the roundabout. Turn right along Epinal Way. Look out for a path named 'Outwoods Way' on the right. Follow this path, keeping in a straight line whilst it briefly joins Holt Drive, goes into a cul-de-sac between between numbers 58 and 60, and leads into Outwoods Avenue. At a small roundabout keep straight on along Outwoods Road. There are good views of the Outwoods as you reach the top of the hill before going downhill. At the end of the road turn left onto Valley Road and follow as far as a signpost on the right which says 'Bridleway to the Outwoods'. Follow this through the bollards and turn right across the grass to the start of the walk.

















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From Shelthorpe Road head up Castledine Street Extension then right into Humphrey Close. Take the signed tarmac footpath branching off to the left following the brook. Turn left at the bridge by the large stump and head left up Burton Walks, passing the buildings of the Loughborough Grammar and High Schools, eventually joining Victoria Street which takes you to **Bedford Square** on the edge of the town centre. Retrace your steps or why not take the bus one way and walk the other?









### Charnwood Water and the Canal

Industrial history and wildlife - Loughborough's past comes to life

From the Charnwood Water car park, off Tuckers Road, go to the right of the toilet block and follow the waterside path. Take the path branching off to the right up over the bridge crossing the Great Central Railway. At the A6 Leicester Road, cross with care over to the cemetery. (A short cut can be taken at this point by going left along the A6). In the cemetery take the access road ahead then, after the crematorium buildings, turn left and follow the path down to a kissing gate. Continue straight on to reach the old lane to Woodthorpe then turn left. After re-crossing both the steam railway and the A6, take the footpath straight ahead down a track. After about 0.5 mile / 0.8 km, where two footpaths cross, turn left and head over a

field towards a metal hand-gate and yellow-topped waymark post. Continue on this path to the canal, then turn left along the towpath towards Loughborough. At the next canal bridge head up the steps onto Moor Lane. Turn left over the road bridge, then left into Great Central Road and left again into Windmill Road. Follow this round until you reach Tuckers Road on the left, and follow this back to Charnwood Water.
