<b>A1.</b>	Sir Henry Hastings
<b>A2.</b>	1,000 – 2,000
<b>A3.</b>	14
<b>A4.</b>	Originally it was an earth mound or ‘motte’, on which the Normans built a ‘keep’. Fact: This ‘motte and bailey’ castle was built around 1068 for Leicester’s first Norman overlord, Hugh de Grandmesnil. More about Leicester Castle is on the <a href="#">Story of Leicester</a> website. Later, in Victorian times, the mound was used as a bowling green. (Both answers are correct).
<b>A5.</b>	Europa Nostra (answer on The Newarke bridge, over the river)
<b>A6.</b>	b. Former railway line. Fact: The brick structure was a viaduct carrying the Great Central Main Line which went from Sheffield in the North, through the midlands to London. It was built in 1899 and this section of the line (Rugby to Nottingham, via Leicester) finally closed in 1969.
<b>A7.</b>	2016
<b>A8.</b>	Leicester’s suffragette Alice Hawkins
<b>A9.</b>	Queen Victoria’s Golden Jubilee. Fact: Queen Victoria succeeded to the throne in 1837, aged 18. The 50 <sup>th</sup> anniversary of her accession was in 1887. She reigned as British monarch for 63 years; longer than any of her predecessors. Our current Queen Elizabeth II has reigned for over 68 years.
